FRANK MARTOCCI 1918-1991

Frank Martocci had a great love and respect for athletic competition and his fellow man. He played Football, Basketball and Lacrosse at Poly Prep and used to pitch batting practice to the baseball team with his lacrosse stick. After graduation he played basketball and lacrosse at Rutgers University. After Rutgers, Frank enlisted in the Army and decided he would serve his country by helping his fellow servicemen as a medic. He was quite busy as he ended up in the Battle of The Bulge during WWII.

After the war Frank worked with his father in the Printing Business. He moved to Manhasset in 1956 where he immediately became involved in the community. Frank was a PBC/PAL Director for 31 years. He coached PBC Football, Baseball and Lacrosse. He was president of the PBC when the PAL/PBC Lacrosse Program was getting started in Manhasset. He was the liaison between the PBC and the High School Coaches. Richie Moran and Luke Belsito who were also instrumental in making the Lacrosse Program a success.

There was a lot of talk in the 1960's about starting a lacrosse team at St. Mary's High School too. When Monsignor Weist succeeded Monsignor Sharp in March of 1969 the talking turned to planning. In 1971 a boys lacrosse team was started and as a volunteer, Frank Martocci was their first coach. By 1980 St. Mary's won the Long Island Private Lacrosse Championship.

Frank was the President of the Manhasset High School Booster Club from 1966-1968. He sponsored the Mayfair Summer Lacrosse Team where many Manhasset graduates played while home from college. He got involved in other community functions as well. You should have seen him in his full indian headdress when he was Cub Scout Leader of Pack 97.

By now you can see that Frank really cared about the Manhasset Community. He was respected by his players, their parents and coaches from Manhasset and Coaches from other towns as well.

Frank Martocci died in 1991 of Pancreatic Cancer. Though he is no longer with us he will long be remembered as a man who cared, got involved and had a positive influence on the lives of all he worked with and taught, both on the field and off. Frank was a humble man who did not ask for much in return except maybe for a thank you.


SCHOLARSHIP

DUNCAN MACINTOSH..... Manhasset H.S. 1961-64

Duncan was a great all around midfielder and a 3 year varsity player at Manhasset. He used his size and speed, from the wing position to help win face offs and thus create offensive opportunities. Just as important, was his ability to get back on defense to stop the opposing team from scoring if the face off was lost.

Duncan's skills helped lead two great Manhasset Teams to Long Island Championships. In 1963 the team went 19-1 and in 1964 they went 16-1. Also all 3 years that he played varsity the team won the year's Sportsmanship Award. Duncan credits his teammates and coaches for their great success. Both Coaches, Richie Moran and Luke Belsito are in this Hall of Fame as are eight of his teammates from those two years.

Of course Duncan proved his own great ability as he earned All Division, All North Shore and All County Honors in his senior year. We are proud to have such a fine athlete join the ranks of other great midfielders in this Hall of Fame.

DOUG FIERO Manhasset H.S. 1971-74

Doug is another fine example of the great defensemen who have played at Manhasset. With good speed and great control of his stick Doug would steel the ball from the opposing attackman, clear it to the offense for a scoring opportunity. It seemed as though Doug could read the attackman's mind and anticipate their moves to prevent them from scoring. In his senior year, Dough helped lead his team to a division title with a record of 17-1. He also earned All County Honors that year.

After graduation from Manhasset Doug attended the University of North Carolina where he used the great education and confidence he gained from his days at Manhasset to help became an excellent student and leader, both in the classroom and on the lacrosse field.

Doug was the Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Honors winner in 1975, 76, 77, and 78. He also received the education award for outstanding senior in 1978. He was all ACC in 1976, 77, and 78. He was voted to the All America Team in 1977 and was voted captain in 1977 and 1978. Congratulations to Doug for such a stellar High School and College Career.

MEGAN GATELY TROTTA Manhasset H.S. 1990-93

Manhasset High School is surely a High School of Excellence which offers an outstanding, well rounded education, thus producing many leaders in many fields. Megan was truly a great leader on the lacrosse field both at Manhasset and at St. Michaels College. As an outstanding defensive player and a great motivator to her teammates she was voted Captain of her freshman team, her Junior Varsity Team and again in her senior year on the Varsity team. The Manhasset Community was very fortunate that Megan came back to coach in the Girl's PAL Program and became such a great role model for our young athletes. Thank you and congratulations Megan.


game.

She was known for her unending endurance, one who could race down the field, catch up defensively with a breakaway at any time, then turn right around and be the start of an offensive fast break. Christine was a shy freshman during the 1988 State Championship Team, the first team to travel to Bermuda. As a Junior, she was voted All County and as a Senior, All American. Upon her graduation, she was also voted Best Attack Player and Most Valuable Player.

Christine went on to play at Loyola College in Maryland, and returned to Manhasset to be the Assistant Coach in 1995. She comes from an exceptional Lacrosse family. Patti-Ann, a 4 year varsity player was a member of the 1985 State Team, and Jimmy an outstanding goalkeeper at Manhasset. 


