BLAKE MILLER


Blake Miller began his lacrosse career just as most other Manhasset lacrosse players, in a PAL uniform. It was very clear from the start that Blake was destined for a great career.

Unfortunately for the Manhasset coaches, Blake played his high school lacrosse at Forman Prep

School in Connecticut where his outstanding play earned him High School All American honors. After graduating from Forman, Blake moved on to Nassau Community College where he was selected as a JUCO All American before crossing Hempstead Turnpike to finish out his college career at Hofstra University. While at Hofstra Blake was voted Player of the Year in the North Atlantic Conference and, of course, selected as a College Division 1 All American.

When Blake's college days were over, everyone thought he had a great career. However, Blake was not finished. He earned gold medals as a member of the 1998 USA World National Team and also in 1999 with the World Cup Team. Professionally Blake played indoors for the New York Saints Before moving over to the Anaheim Storm. He also plays Major League Lacrosse for the Bridgeport Barrage and has been selected as an All Star on two occasions.

Mario began his lacrosse career just as many others of his era, on Memorial Field in Manhasset with Jason Stranahan.

Many years of hard work and practice turned Mario into one of the finest Goalies on any Manhasset roster. However, in 1965 the Richie Moran coached team needed help on defense. Since Manhasset had other goalies and Mario would do anything to help the team, he converted to defense with the expecatation of returning to the goal his senior year. After a stellar junior season on defense in 1965 helping the team to win the Nassau County Championship, the coaches decided to keep a long stick in Mario's hands. Further improvement in 1966 under the tutelage of Renzie Lamb, Mario earned All County Honors and went on to play for The University of Maryland.

Mario's love for the sport prompted him to stay involved. From 1976 through 1986 Mario coached boys of all ages with the Woodstock Vermont Recreation Dept. club team. From 1986 to 1996 Woodstock Middle School was the beneficiary of his efforts. In 2001 Mario began coaching the goalies for the Woodstock High School Varsity Lacrosse Team, a responsibility he still enjoys today. Like so many others from Manhasset, Mario continues to give back to the sport.

Moving to Manhasset during grammar school, John began his lacrosse career in the 5th grade; late by Manhasset standards. Midfield was his position of choice until changing to defense in the 9th grade.

With John's talent he quickly became a cornerstone of the Manhasset defense and earned high school All American honors. After watching him play in high school, it was no surprise that the Johns Hopkins coaching staff offered John the opportunity to play for them in college where he became a 2 time collegiate All American and was selected as a North/South game all star. College was not the end of his career. John became a club all star and was honored as USCLA Defenseman of the Year while playing for the New York Athletic Club. John also played for the USA World Cup Team, The Philadelphia Wings, and the Long Island Lizards professional teams.

Also, of great importance to all of us, John continues his relationship with Manhasset lacrosse by coaching our young PAL boys and running camps and clinics with No Limit Lacrosse Camp. Congratulations John!!

Carolyn was an outstanding 3 sport all star athlete while at Manhasset High School. She was a four year varsity player in field hockey, basketball, and lacrosse. Because of her leadership and her ability, Carolyn was selected as team captain for all three sports. In fact, Carolyn was such an exceptional defensive lacrosse player that she played for 3 years as a US Women's Lacrosse Nationals player, was selected to play in the High School North/South All Star Game and earned All American Lacrosse honors in her senior year.

In 1993 Carolyn's brilliant talents earned her entrance and a scholarship to The University of Virginia in Charlottesville, VA. At UVa. Carolyn continued to show off her tenacious defense and skilled play by stopping the opponents most dangerous and talented players throughout her career. Prior to departing from Virginia, Carolyn was selected to play in the North/South Women's College All Star Game and was also selected as a Regional College All American Player.

Congratulations to you Carolyn. Your resume speaks for itself and your addition to The Manhasset Hall of Fame is well deserved.

Manhasset H.S. 1980 RON CARO.....


Ron Caro was an outstanding athlete while enrolled at Manhasset High School. For his exceptional

play in both football and lacrosse, Ron warranted selection on various All-Division and All-Conference teams and to top it off, he was chosen to the High School All-American lacrosse team in 1983.

Ron attended the United States Military Academy prior to transferring to Hofstra University where he immediately slid into the starting line up. While finishing his education at Queens College, Ron set records for most face-offs won and for most points scored by a midfielder. The tenacity and work ethic necessary to be a top face-off man was the trademark of Ron's playing career.

Prior to being commissioned in the United States Marine Corps where he was deployed during the Los Angeles riots and later to Somalia. Ron spent time as an assistant coach at Cardoza High School in Bayside, New York. Ron's lacrosse involvement continued as a coach for La Jolla High School and later on coaching at Loyola Marymount in California. His playing days were also extended in the club leagues.

It is our honor to include Ron Caro in the 2004 induction class of the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame.




SCHOLARSHIP
