PLAYERS

CHRISTOPHER "WHITEY" ADAMS M.H.S. 1977-1981

Whitey like most of the young men in Manhasset began playing in the Saturday morning PBC intramural program at the Munsey Park School. The program was probably more competitive then any travel team game today. The boys played against each other for bragging rights at school for an entire week. But out of that program grew some great friendships and we witness one of those lifelong friendships tonight between Whitey and Tiny.

Whitey excelled as a midfielder for Ed Colverd's 2 undefeated Manhasset Junior High teams. He then moved up the ladder, as most players do to Varsity and played for Coach Alan Lowe and Bob Rule his Junior and Senior years, where he was selected as a Captain his last year. Coach Lowe indicates that, "although Whitey might not have been the most decorated, he was the most dedicated." Whitey finished his career at Manhasset with All-Division honors.

Whitey accepted an appointment to the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis and was a four year starter. He was chosen as a Captain his senior year and represented the Naval Academy in the North South Senior Game in 1985. Whitey continued as a supporter, coaching several years as a Coach to the Naval Lacrosse Camp.

Whitey, like so many of the participants who went through this program, "paid it forward" once again, and has coached in the Garden City PAL program from 2004-2012. He is married to Marian for 24 years, and is a proud father of 3 children; Madeline, Brendan, and Caroline. Welcome home Whitey.



M.H.S. 1999-2003

Kate Breslin is most likely one the most decorated female lacrosse player to grace Manhasset's fields. As an attack player, she was a threat to all opponents; strategically, face-guarding could not even stop her. Even though Kate graduated in 2003, her awards came in early and often. She earned All-County Honorable mention, as a freshman – unheard of, yet all knew, Kate had yet another three years to grow. As a sophomore, Honorable Mention All-American, and as a Junior and Senior, she achieved All-American honors, as well as the Newsday All Long Island Team. As a lead scorer on the team, one who held the record for most goals in a game, season and career, Kate led her 2003 team to the 3rd New York State Championship. Her coach Tom Campolettano describes her as "The best, absolutely the finest player I have coached".

Kate went on to play at The University of Virginia, where as a freshman, she was part of the NCAA championship team and as a sophomore and junior, UVA was a finalist in the National Tournament. Kate still holds the record for most goals in a season at 68. Among other awards and honors both team and individual, Kate's largest accomplishment was that she was a Tewaaraton Award Nominee – given to the finest female lacrosse college player of the year. As a senior, she also received the Virginia State player of the year, and has a multitude of fond memories of high school and college play.

Kate has been busy this past month, as she was recently married. Welcome to the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame, Kate, we've been waiting for you.

CARLYN KENNY CASEY

M.H.S. 1985-1989

Carlyn was a three varsity player on the Girls' Lacrosse team while at Manhasset. She was a strong defensive player, playing low defense, a threat to any scorer who entered the scoring area. She was selected as a co-captain her Junior year, was named the "Outstanding Defensive player on Long Island" by the Coaches Association, and was selected to the original, very prestigious Long Island Schoolgirls Team. She was an integral part of the 1988 NYS Championship team that Manhasset produced. Her senior year, Carlyn, was again voted captain of the team, that went undefeated in Conference play, again selected to the High School Schoolgirls Team, as co-captain, and was voted as an All-American player. Carlyn went on to play at Princeton University, and after 2 years, went on to enjoy other pursuits, including another passion for theatre.

Carlyn's enthusiasm didn't stop at Lacrosse. She was a Football Cheerleader, and Basketball and Volleyball and Sports Night Captain! Her participation earned her the very prestigious Silver M membership.

Carlyn took on challenges always with a huge smile, and a contagious laughter. She possessed an enduring love for the game. She returned to Manhasset, in 2005, and shortly thereafter she began coaching PAL as she did Saturday mornings 24 years ago. Pam Monfort said of Carlyn: "She was such a dedicated player, this honor is long overdue". Carlyn is married to Bill, and they have three children, Seanne (6th grade), Will (4th grade) and Skye (2nd grade).

RAYMOND "TINY" CRAWFORD M.H.S. 1977-1981

Tiny began his career in lacrosse when Mike Adams gave him his first stick. He began practicing for hours, each day throwing a ball against a wall. He made the PBC 12 year old travel team coached by Harry Baugher, Sr., and eventually moved on to Manhasset Junior High and played on two undefeated teams for Coach Ed Colverd. Tiny ultimately was a three year Varsity player at Manhasset as a sophomore; something that didn't happen often in the 80's. Tiny played mid-field for coaches Lowe and Rule, but his specialty would be the art of facing off. Seeing great potential, Harry Baugher, Jr., was brought in to work with Tiny, who became one of the best face off players in the country. Tiny was selected as a team Captain and was selected as All-County his senior year.

Tiny attended U.S. Military Prep School at Monmouth, NJ for a year and received an appointment to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. He played for Coach Dick Edell and handled the face off duties for an Army team that was 11-2 and made the NCAA playoffs. The highlight of that season was facing off against his best friend, Whitey Adams, in the Army-Navy game. Neither one will say who got the best of whom that day. Coach Dick Edell called Tiny the "hardest working player both on the field and in the classroom that he ever coached."

As the academic burden became tough for Tiny, he transferred to Hobart College, and was an intricate part of the three NCAA Division III National Championship Teams. He returned home to play in three Manhasset Lacrosse Day of Champions games. His senior year, he was selected Captain of the 1987 Hobart Team.

At graduation, Tiny fulfilled his dream and was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps. He was deployed to Kuwait and served our nation in both Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

Tiny is married to his beautiful wife of 22 years, Maryann and has two lovely daughters; Brittany, 21 and Courtney, 19.

MICHAEL MONAHAN M.H.S. 1992-1995

Michael Monahan played on the varsity MHS from 1992-1995 and was co-captain his senior year of the State Championship winning team. Monahan was a left handed attackman who quarterbacked his team to its first MHS lacrosse state title in 1995. He led the team in assists that year, and in the play-off period alone had 24 assists in the coveted Woodstick Classic against Garden City. Additionally, Monahan had a crucial assist to beat Stony Brook in double overtime in the 1995 Long Island Championship game, which put Manhasset on the road to state. Monahan was selected to be part of the Long Island Select Team in 1994.

Monahan was also a standout Football player at MSH and was awarded Defensive MVP in the 1994 Long Island Championships Monahan played Lacrosse at the University of Delaware where his team made the playoffs two consecutive seasons.

Monahan married Sarah Pfeiffer on May 14, 2011, and they are expecting their first baby in August. They live on the Upper West Side, and Monahan is a broker at Chapdelaine Company.
