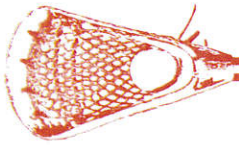

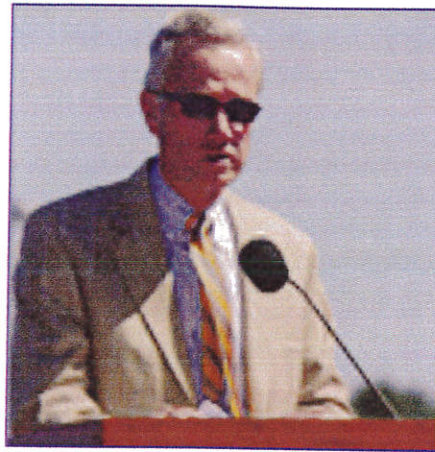

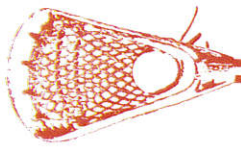
Frank has always been an outstanding member of the Manhasset community, one of 4 sons of Alice and Frank, Sr., he followed in his father's path – two particularly important – law and PAL. He graduated from St. John's University School of Law in 1980 where he was a member of the Law Review and the recipient of the Award for Excellence in Commercial Transactions.

He has been the acting Justice for the Village of Munsey Park Village Court, and has been a Board Member of the Rangers Lead the Way Fund until last year. He is the Past-President of the St. Mary's High School Alumni Association and Founding Member of the St. Mary's School Board. His passion for his parish and former High School is not because of his accolades as a basketball player there, averaging 16 points per game with a field goal percentage not less than 60% in every game. Nor was it the establishment of the St. Mary's High School record for consecutive foul shots, but it is his firm belief and conviction of faith, and a passion for his community that he has spent his lifetime committed to serving.

As the Current President of the Manhasset Unit of the Nassau County PAL, and Executive Director of the Boys and Girls (Lacrosse) program, Frank has the ultimate responsibility of organizing, scheduling, recruitment of coaches, registration of players, arrangement of practice times and places, and decision maker for all of our youth. It is a daunting task. Bill Miller, all too well, knows the undertaking, and indicates that "Frank has been a great successor to the position! In this time of technology, Frank truly understands the needs of our families and has involved a record number of boys and girls, coaches, and parents in our outstanding PAL program." Bill and Frank worked side by side as co-executive Directors of Boys Lacrosse from 1997-2007. Frank has also served as the PAL Baseball Commissioner with the re-introduction of baseball in Manhasset.

Frank and his wife Ellen, are proud parents of 4 children, Kevin, Frank, Billy and Alice, all of whom, he points out, played lacrosse in high school and college.

Tonight, Frank is inducted as a 'Contributor' to the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame. Frank is the leader in Manhasset's youth sports. His passion for greatness, involvement, professionalism, fairness, and competition is evident in the success of our youth programs.

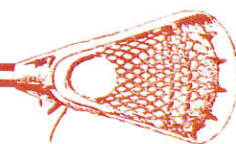

She enjoyed being a part of the team, the friendships that it provided, the work ethic that was demanded, and the overall experience of embracing achievements, individually, and team wise. She was a member of the team for one of the teams' trips to Bermuda. Her smile and her effervescence is something that is always remembered not only throughout her years at Manhasset, but following her return to her home town. Whitney was the Co-President of the Girls Athletic Association, and was a proud wearer of Purple for Sports Night! Her coach Pam Monfort remembered Whitney as a 'strong contributor to our team, her smile brightened every day on the field. Her team commitment was second to none, and her willingness to always improve was always evident.'

Whitney is being inducted this evening as a "Contributor". There is no one who has contributed more to girls' lacrosse recently, as well as the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame, and the Manhasset Community. Whitney has coached for the Manhasset PAL for both Field Hockey and Lacrosse during the past several years. She is the Town Coordinator for both, and spends time with the girls encouraging them to be the best they can be, but having fun at the same time. In addition, Whitney serves on the Manhasset School SCA Board, as the Middle School President, and is a member of the Manhasset Women's Coalition Against Breast Cancer.

Whitney has been a Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame member for numerous years, taking over the registration responsibilities, as well as coordinating the raffles that have become a popular event each year. A Goettelmann who didn't excel in Lacrosse? Unheard of! As a matter of fact, this is our third induction of the Goettelmann dynasty following brothers George in 1993, and Timmy in 2010. All well deserving, as the Goettelmanns are known for their toughness on the field, their tenacious play and their passion for the game. Gunnar embodies all of these attributes. It must be in their DNA.

Gunnar was a three sport athlete, with honors in each of those sports. As a 3 year starter for the Football team, and team Captain, Gunnar helped the team achieve the County Championship during his junior year. He was honored All-County that year, where he recorded a record 12 interceptions, and All-State, his senior year. He was a team Captain both years.

In Basketball, Gunnar lettered 2 years, was named All-Conference, and was part of the County Championship team (again) his junior year.

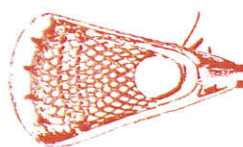
It was Lacrosse, that he lettered 3 years and achieved All Conference his sophomore year, All County awards his junior year, and All-American his senior year. Timmy was a Senior Captain, and led the team in goals and assists during his Junior and Senior years.

Coach Lowe remembers Gunnar as a player who played hard during practices and games. "He didn't know how to play less than full speed all the time. He did it all, He could shoot, dodge, feed, and had a great eye to see the whole field. He was a tenacious rider, and caused a tremendous amount of turnovers. He never gave up".

And he never gave up even when he played at Loyola. He was a 4 year participant for the Greyhounds, was selected as the Team Captain his senior year. He led the team in assists for two years. While on the team, Loyola was a participant in the NCAA quarter finals two times.

Gunnar has 'given back' to the communities that he has lived. He has been involved in Catholic Charities in the Big Brother/Sister Organization. He has been a member of the Woman In Distress of Broward County, Inc. which is the only nationally accredited, state-certified, full service domestic violence center serving Broward County, whose mission is to stop domestic violence abuse for everyone through intervention, education and advocacy. He is also a member of Autism Speaks, and Surfers Healing, which enriches the lives of people living with autism by exposing them to the unique experience of surfing.

Gunnar recently has moved back to Manhasset with his wife Sondra, and their children Cooper and Myles. He is presently coaching Cooper's team in the PAL, where he started his career in Lacrosse. Life is a cycle. We are so fortunate to have you back Gunnar!



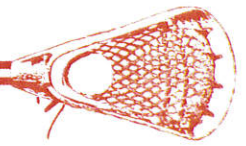

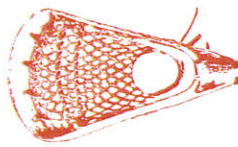

Ariana is one of those millennial, full achieving girls' Lacrosse players that came through Manhasset under the prowess of Coach Tom Campolettano. As a three Varsity sport athlete, Ariana was just warmed up in the spring and achieved her greatness in this sport. She was a 2 year Varsity player on the Field Hockey team and a 3 year participant on the Basketball team, yet Lacrosse became her craving.

Her junior year, 2003, Ariana played a significant role as a principal attack player to lead the team to the New York State Champions! A three-year starter, she received All-County recognition in 2003 and 2004, Academic All-American in 2003 and 2004, and became the first recipient of the Marilyn Sheerin Manhasset Booster Club Scholarship for academic and athletic excellence. She was the winner of the Brine Choice Award in 2004 for her performance in the New York State Class B Championship game, and played on the New York State National Team 2 at the 2003 National Tournament.

Coach Campi remembers her as tenacious player. "She was fast, she was resilient, she made her teammates better players. Ariana never gave up, our success in 2003 was significantly because of her leadership on the field. The team gelled and we were able to capture the State Championship. Ariana came to us as an attacker and made the move to defense and took to it like she was born to play the position. Strong aggressive on ball lock down defender. Great clearing ability!"

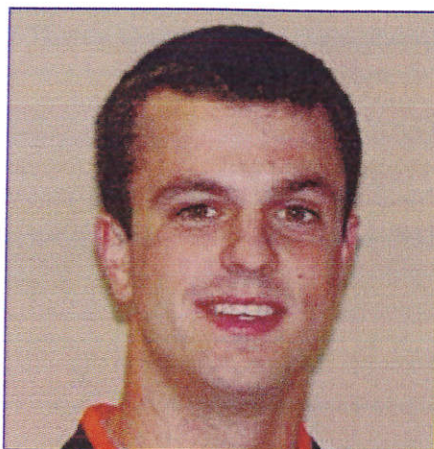
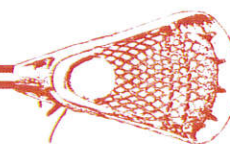
Ariana went on to play at Stanford University and played 3 years, assisting the team to win the MPSF Championships 2005, 2006, and 2007. While on the team, Stanford became the first team west of the Mississippi to qualify for the NCAA Tournament without an automatic bid. She started in that game vs. Northwestern in 2006. She was an academic All-Conference player in 2006 and 2007.

After graduating from Stanford, she remained in 'sunny' California, yet moved to San Francisco to work in marketing for Tech companies. She returned to her hometown state in 2010, and was employed by David Yurman, working in the digital marketing field. Last year, she started working for L'Oreal and continues to work for the company today as the Director of Digital Marketing.

Ariana is a volunteer for Year Up, which is a non-profit organization that helps at risk and under privileged youth obtain vocational training and placement in Internships at Fortune 500 companies. She serves as a mentor for kids and young adults that are involved with the organization. Ariana also coaches occasionally with City Lax, started by our own Matt Levine!

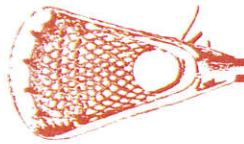
He was decorated in Football, Indoor Track and Lacrosse. As a 3 year Varsity team member in Football, and a senior Captain, Chris played Offensive line/Linebacker, and earned All-County and Academic All-County awards, as well as the All Long Island Golden Eleven, awarded by the National Football Foundation for the "best and brightest players the country has to offer". He was also named as a Wendy's High School Heisman State Finalist. In Winter Track, Chris was part of a three time undefeated Conference Championship team, and was a two time All-Conference Shot Putter.

However, Lacrosse was Chris's passion and the sport he excelled at while at Manhasset, and at Princeton. Coach Alan Lowe said of Chris, "What a great defensive player Chris was. As the game's intensity elevated, so did Chris's strength. He was a huge part of the undefeated season; he would just do things you took for granted".

As a 4 year starter for Manhasset, Chris was a part of a team that were 3 years, County Champions, Long Island Champion and 1 year Undefeated State Champions (2004) He was Captain of the team, and was awarded a multitude of honors including, 2 time All-Conference, 2 time All-County, 2 time All-American, 2 time Long Island Empire team, and 2 time NCLCA Howdy Meyers Defensive Player of the year. His ability and prowess in the game carried on as a 4 year Letter player for Princeton University, where he was a 2009 graduate. While a Tiger, Chris dominated the defensive end. His team was 2006 and 2009 Ivy League Champions, and he personally was bestowed 2 time All-American, 3 time All-Ivy League, 2 time Academic All-Ivy, and 1 time Academic All-American. He was a team Captain his senior year.

Upon graduation, he jumped in to the business world, but found time to play for the NYAC. Following in his late father Ed's footsteps, Chris has been a proud member of the Plandome Fire Department since his junior year at Manhasset, and continues his membership today. He admires the brotherhood, the ability to help not only his community, but mutual aid opportunities, and his willingness to risk his life for others. He was a former member of the Princeton Volunteer Fire Department, and presently is a member of the Leadership Council of Student Sponsor Partners, a New York City based mentorship program for under privileged high school students.
