CONRAD J. "SUDS" SUTHERLAND

Conrad J. Sutherland, known as "Suds" was an All American Lacrosse player from the class of 1924 at Princeton University. He moved to Manhasset in 1938 and very shortly was one of the few referees of high school lacrosse games.

For example, during the 1940's, when there were few if any referees available because of the war, he would typically referee a couple of games on the weekend, and leave his job in the city on a noontime train to referee a high school game on a Wednesday. Many of these games were Manhasset games because there were only four other teams in the league at that time: Garden City, Sewanhaka, Poly Prep and Eastern Military Academy.

Mr. Sutherland was close to "Strany" (the man who started lacrosse at Manhasset by fielding the first team at Manhasset H.S. in 1932) Phil Ruggiero and Ken Molloy, among others, in promoting lacrosse in Manhasset. Each year Strany would bring Manhasset H.S. to play New England prep schools and "Suds" would help arrange games at Deerfield, Mt. Herman, Andover, and the like.

Although refereeing local games became part of Mr. Sutherland's life, he was also active in lacrosse on a national scale, serving as Chairman of the annual North-South game held at the polo grounds in New York City, and President of the National Collegiate Lacrosse Association. He stayed active as an official in both Manhasset and National Lacrosse until his untimely death in 1961.

His name will long be honored by the town of Manhasset and in Lacrosse History.



..... Manhasset H.S. 1973-76

David was one of the best face off midfielders to play at Manhasset. According to Coach Alan Lowe, David was "A well rounded player who did all the dirty work on the field". He had all the right qualities needed at the position that fights for the ball placed on the ground at the start of every quarter and after every score. He was big, strong and totally focussed on the job at hand. David was also a great defensive player and Coach Lowe would have him cover the best opposing offensive player. He was a great scoring threat with a blazing fast shot which allowed him to score five goals in one just one game against Levitown Division.

David's best attribute was his leadership which made him like a third coach on the field because he was

able to really motivate his fellow players.

In 1976, his senior year, David earned All North Shore Honors and he helped lead his team to two Nassau County Championships in 1975 and 1976.

David continued his lacrosse success at the University of Maryland where he lead his team to be runners up for a National Championship his senior year.

Congratulations to one of the best midfielders to ever play lacrosse for Manhasset.

MICAELA GRIMM..... Manhasset H.S. 1986-89

Micaela was a three-sport varsity athlete at Manhasset. She was an All County Field Hockey player earning All League status as a sophomore and continued to achieve success in the program as a Halfback and link to earn the Field Hockey Honor Award. She also played Varsity Basketball, and was awarded the Senior All Sports award upon her graduation in 1989.

Micaela will be most remembered for her phenomenal effort as a starting line Lacrosse defensive player for the Varsity team for 3 years. In those three years, she never missed a game, and the quote "Offense wins games, Defense wins Championships" truly credits her playing ability. She was the key factor of the strategic "double team" effort with diffeerent partners every year. She was especially a key defensive player in the 1988 State Championship team. As stable and patient defensively, she was also the initial offensive player, as most clears would go to her. In 1989 as a senior she was captain of the team and received All County Honors.

Micaela went on to play 4 years at Loyola College. She helped lead her team to the 1990 NCAA semifinals. In 1993 she played on the North South All Star Team. After college Micaela started coaching young athletes who played on the PAL girls teams. She presently plays for the NYAC women's club team.

BRIAN RICE..... Manhasset H.S. 1977-80

A proud but humble man Brian credits great coaching, at every level, for his lacrosse success. He was a well balanced midfielder at Manhasset who was great at gathering up ground balls. This is mentioned so often but ball control is so important in lacrosse, as it is in many other sports. Brian was able to develope many fast breaks to the goal creating as many scoring opportunities. Brian also used his speed to get back on defense to stop the opposing team's fast breaks. That's what the transitional position of midfield is all about and few did it better than Brian.

He earned All Division Honors in his junior year and was elected to the All Conference Team his senior year in 1980.

After graduation Brian went to the University of North Carolina where he was a 4 year varsity player. He helped his team win two Division Championships in 1981 and 1982. They also went to the final four in his junior and senior years in 1983 and 1984.

Brian certainly has some great memories about his lacrosse career. But he really enjoyed playing in the Manhasset PBC program for Coach W. Harry Baugher especially when they won the 12 year old L.I. Championship. Brian considers those early lacrosse days to be some of his most exciting ever. He enjoyed playing in the PAL so much that after graduation from college he came back to Manhasset to be a PAL coach himself. Congratulations and thank you Brian.



WALTER "BUDDY" DEHOUST Manhasset H.S. 1960-


Much has been said and written about the 1967 undefeated (18-0) L.I. Champion Manhasset lacrosse team. Buddy played on another one of the best teams in Manhasset H.S. history. In 1963, as a senior, this All North Shore goalkeeper helped lead his team to an incredible 19-1 season. The first game of the year they lost a great defensive battle to Freeport by the score of 3-2. With Buddy, now shouting orders louder than ever to his defense, the team went on to win their next 19 games in a row thus capturing the Long Island Championship and for Buddy the honor of making the All Scholastic North Shore team.

After graduation from Manhasset Buddy went to the University of Maryland where he was a 3 year varsity player. He continued to lead his defense to victory and made the All State team his senior year and

was voted to the North South All Star team.

Walter "Buddy" Dehoust was a great leader in lacrosse but he was an even greater leader in life. He served in the United States Marine Corp. for 26 years and retired at the rank of Colonel. We are proud of Buddy for what he has done for his community and for the United States of America as well.

BRANDY SCHNITZER.....

Brandy was an outstanding lacrosse player at Manhasset. As a sophomore playing Defensive Wing. She was voted All Conference. In her junior year coach Pam Monfort switched her to Attack Wing, mainly for her speed and strength. At that new position she earned All League Honors. In 1988 as a senior Brandy scored 44. goals and had 15 assists while winning the N.Y. State Championship. She was awarded as an All-County and All-State player that year. The combination of Hall of Famer Sabrina Gallagher and Brandy were almost undefendable, which accounted for Manhasset's great success that year.

After high school Brandy got involved in lacrosse in this community in a big way. She helped start the girl's lacrosse program at St. Mary's H.S. There she coached for 4 years with a record of 42-6-0. Brandy then made the move back over to Manhasset to coach the girl's Jr. Varsity team. From 1997-99 she compiled a record of 30-6-0. Brandy is presently the Varsity Assistant Coach and hopes to stay in this position for awhile as she is finishing school at Hofstra as a physical education major. We thank her for what she has accomplished in this community and wish her luck in the future both as a Coach and getting married into the Miller Family (Patrick) this summer.

The Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame Honors those who have given something to this community's lacrosse program, whether it be as a player, a coach or a contributor. Lester has done all three. He started early playing for "Stranny" in the PBC program as a defenseman. He remained a defensive player until his senior year when Coach Tom Postel converted Lester from defense to help out on the midfield. of our community.

He has coached in the PAL program for 10 years and has been commissioner of the PAL at three levels
