TIM COUGHLIN...... St. Mary's Boys H.S. 1973-1976

t the end of this month the town of Manhasset, like so many other towns across America, will celebrate Memorial Day in it's traditional fashion, with a parade up Plandome Road. But this Memorial Day will be very different. More people of this community died in the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001 than in the Civil War, World War I, the Korean War and Vietnam combined.

Tim Coughlin was the third of the four sons of Alice and Frank Coughlin. His magnificent life was unjustly claimed in the September 11th attack on the World Trade Center. Tim was married to the former Maura O'Callaghan of Woodbury and left behind three children: a 4-1/2 year-old daughter Ryann and sons 3 year-old Sean and 6 month-old Riley.

As a young boy although Tim was thin and small in stature, he developed two traits that would carry him throughout his life: a competitive nature in anything he did together with the ability to make, keep and build upon friendships. He grew up in Manhasset in the 60's and 70's as a typical athletic kid did in those pre-soccer days under the patient coordination of Patrolmen Dick Widmeyer and Tom Raliegh, participating in Police Boy's Club activities including Football, Basketball, Baseball and Lacrosse.

Despite the incredible lacrosse talent passing through its doors, St. Mary's High School did not introduce lacrosse as a varsity sport until Tim's junior year, the spring of 1975. Tim was a punishing midfielder who was "all desire" and he led Coach Cosmo DeLillo's team with his tenacity and hard work. When you played with Tim you learned to play to win and to play hard. Tim earned MVP for the team in his senior year leading the team together with Mike Hayes and Owen Tunney. Tim also played basketball at St. Mary's, and in his senior year he was the Varsity's Most Valuable Player.

Current Manhasset and Port PAL coaches Tommy Adams, Marty Bergin and Ron Gallo were teammates of Tim's at St. Mary's. Tim during his younger days in the PBC program and throughout his career in the securities business developed life-long friendships with many Manhasset and St. Mary's High School lacrosse players, most notably the great Johnny Driscoll, Eugene Miller and Skip Vosburgh.

"Tim was very proud of his younger brother Rob, a member of the 1979 St. Mary's CHSAA Championship Team who later went on to play midfield at Princeton University."

Tim and his brothers also made contributions to the Manhasset Booster Club to help support the


Manhasset H.S. Lacrosse Program.

Tim was, to no surprise of those who knew him well, a fabulous father, a devoted husband and a terrific uncle. He enjoyed being with all his kids and his nephews and nieces and he made them laugh like he made adults laugh.

Tim loved the game of lacrosse as played and coached in Manhasset. He looked forward to the day when he would coach his kids and continue to be a part of this wonderful program. By virtue of his induction tonight, Tim Coughlin will share forever in the great tradition of Manhasset Lacrosse.

There are more than 18,000 residents living in Manhasset all of which knew someone who lost their life on 9/11. Perhaps it was a customer, a neighbor, a friend, a family member or someone's hero. Tim Coughlin was all of these.

Peter was an excellent all around athlete at Manhasset. In addition to being a 3 year varsity player in lacrosse he also played varsity Football and basketball.

In his junior year Peter earned All Conference Honors in Basketball and All League Honors in Lacrosse. Peter had a great senior year in athletics. He was an All County Basketball Player and while showing his leadership qualities as Captain he led the Lacrosse Team to the county playoffs earning All-American Honors.

After graduating from Manhasset, Peter went to John Hopkins University continuing his lacrosse career he was a four year varsity player. 1994, in his junior year he was voted the outstanding midfielder at Hopkins and earned All American Honors. In his senior ear of '95 Peter did it again and was the outstanding Hopkins middy and earned All-American Honors. Peter showed his dedication to lacrosse after college as well.

Peter played for the Philadelphia Wings Pro Indoor Lacrosse Team for 5 years. In 1998 he was a member of Team USA and was a Gold Medal winner. Last year he was a member of the N.J. Pride Pro Outdoor Team and this year as a volunteer, he is helping to coach The University of Pennsylvania Lacrosse Team.

MICHELE CUSIMANO Manhasset H.S. 1989-92

Michelle was a four year varsity goalie at Manhasset High School and with great reflexes and speed she recorded over 900 saves during those years. She earned All-American Honors in both her junior and senior years.

After graduating from Manhasset in 1992, Michelle went on to play lacrosse at The University of Virginia. In each of the three years that Michelle started for the Cavaliers, she broke the record for saves in a season. In her third year, Michelle broke the UVA record for saves in a career. In 1993, Michelle was a member of the 1993 NCAA Championship Team, and helped the Cavaliers return to the Final Four in 1994. In 1996, she guided the Cavaliers return to the NCAA final game. In that game, Michelle had 26 saves, a record in NCAA final round action that still stands today. In her career along the way, Michelle was named to the NCAA All-Tournament team; earned Academic All-American Honors; and was a three-time All-American, earning First Team Honors in 1995 and 1996. Michelle was the first person to be named Goalie of the Year twice in 1995 and 1996. She received the Markland Kelly Award as the National Goalkeeper of the Year in 1995 and 1996.

We are honored to add Michelle's name to the list of Manhasset's Finest Lacrosse Players.

BOB JENKINS Manhasset H.S. 1962-65

Bob Jenkins was a 3 year varsity midfielder at Manhasset and credits teamwork for the great success of the teams he played on. During those years he played varsity at Manhasset he shared the field with 12 members of this Hall of Fame. Bob was introduced to the game by The Late Jason Stranahan while at Plandome Road School and was coached by Luke Belsito and Richie Moran. All three are also members of this Hall of Fame. The performance of these men helped Manhasset play for The Long Island Championship for those three years, winning it in 63′ and 64′. During that time period they only lost 3 games and Bob earned All County Honors his senior year.

After graduating from Manhasset Bob went to the United States Military Academy at West Point. Freshman were not allowed to play varsity at that time so Bob lead the Freshman Lacrosse Team to an undefeated season. He was a varsity starter the next 3 years and helped lead them to their last National Championship in 1969.

After graduating from West Point, teamwork was most important to Bob as he served overseas in Europe and Korea as an Army Officer. We thank Bob for his commitment to lacrosse and to The United States of America.

BILL GAHAN Manhasset H.S. 1981-84

Bill was a great all around midfielder at Manhasset H.S. His great defensive and offensive play spanned three years as a varsity player. Bill was known for his great sportsmanship and self control. In the three years Bill played at Manhasset they compiled a 52-11 record. In 1984, his senior year, Bill was the teams leading scorer. He was voted the most valuable player in the county playoff game, helped Manhasset win The Long Island Championship and earned All-American Honors. Coach Alan Lowe said, that Bill was his "Go To Guy". Whenever we really needed a score in a tough situation Bill was the player I would depend on. He was an excellent dodger and if he would be picked up on a slide by the defense, Bill would find the open man passing off for the assist.

After graduating from Manhasset Bill went on to be a 4 year varsity player in college. As a freshman and sophomore at Boston College. And as a junior and senior at University of Virginia. Bill will always be remembered as one of the great midfielders in Manhasset History. Congratulations.


