





COACH



EDWARD COLYERD

Ed began his coaching career at Alva T. Stanforth Junior High School in Elmont in 1970. In his first year he coached the Tigers to an undefeated 10-0 season and in 1971 he led the team to a 9-1 record. In 1975 he was named the Freshman Lacrosse Coach at Manhasset JR-SR High School and directed the team to seven consecutive undefeated seasons compiling a 70-0 record. He then became Varsity Lacrosse Coach at St. Mary's High School in Manhasset. He led the Gaels to two championships and a 237-85 record. His teams were consistently highly ranked satewide. While. at St. Mary's Ed was twice named the NSCHSAA coach of the year and was twice named the Man of the Year for his outstanding contributions to the game of Lacrosse. Ed's overall record is 355-87 (.803 pct).

Ed has coached numerous high school and college lacrosse All Americans during his career and coached the Long Island Empire Lacrosse team to three gold medals and one silver medal from 1995 to 1999. He also founded the Baggataway Lacrosse Jamboree, with Alan Lowe, and the long Island Lacrosse Coaches Clinic.

Ed coached football at Manhasset for 12 years as an Assistant Coach and helped the Indians to win four Nassau County football championships.

Outside of lacrosse, Ed has been the Director of Adaptive Driver Education at Abilities, Inc. in Albertson for the past 34 years, where he has received national and international recognition for his accomplishments in teaching individuals with disabilities to drive.


MIKE MAGEE M.H.S. 1981—1984

Mike is another product of our great PAL lacrosse program. A midfielder with quick agility and great ground ball skills, he played on the man up and man down teams and became a face off specialist. In 1984 his athletic ability was obvious as he earned All County Honors in lacrosse and football and helped lead Manhasset to a Long Island Championship in lacrosse.

After graduation Mike went to Syracuse University. Using his face off and defensive middy skills, he helped lead Syracuse to a Division One National Championship in 1989. After graduating from Syracuse, Mike moved to Canada where his brother lived and was involved in larosse. Mike also got involved in a big way. In 1989 with a team called the Brooklin Redman, they wre Ontaio Provincial Champions and Canadian National Finalists. Mike was Head Coach of the Toronto Beaches Club Team from 1992 - 1996. He was the Head Coach of the Ontario 19 and under All Stars in 1995. He was an Assistant Coach of the Canadian Junior National Team playing in Tokyo in 1996.

Since 2000 Mike has been back here in Manhasset coaching PAL lacrosse.

ROB COUGHLIN ST. MARYS H.S. 1977—1980

Rob Coughlin is the youngest of four brothers, all of whom played varsity basketball at St Mary's Manhasset. He was a member of the 1979 Long Island Catholic League Basketball Champions and the 1980 Long Island Catholic League Lacrosse Champions. He is the only player in school history to be on championship teams in both sports. Rob played with some exceptional players at St. Mary's High School and College All-Americans Marty Bergin, Bryan Byrnes (Manhasset Hall of Fame Member) and John Schimoler. All, who have great respect for Rob's leadership on the field and in the classroom.

After St. Mary's, Rob went on to play mid-field at Princeton University between 1981 and 1984. He once again excelled on the field and in the classroom and was reunited with PBC teammates, Peter Cordrey, Billy Donohue and Joe Rigney.

Rob's dad, Frank, was one of the founding fathers of the Manhasset PBC. Rob's brother Tim, who was tragically killed in the 9/11 attacks, also enjoyed an exceptional career, and is a member of the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame. His brother Frank is a driving force in our current PAL lacrosse program. Manhasset has been blessed to have such a great family involved in the program.

Rob played several years for the NYAC after college and is now currently running a youth lacrosse program in Manhattan.

JULES TORTOLANI

M.H.S. 1983—1986

Julie Tortolani is the only female player in Manhasset's history to have played 6 Varsity seasons. Graduating in 1986, her experience took her through both the "dinosaur" years and then finished her career as a part of the 1985 State Championship team. Julie was "sighted" in 6th grade throwing a lacrosse ball, with a boys stick to her dog "Drummer" and then was quickly recruited by Coach Monfort. She started as an attack player and moved to Center during her Junior and Senior years, scoring over 65 goals, and was awarded All-County during her final season. Julie was also "found" by legendary coach Allen Dawson where she excelled in field events, being termed a "natural". She went on to University of Vermont for track and field, and returned to her loved sport, Lacrosse. Julie was a "natural". Her love of the game and the support of her family were evident in all of her games, and we know her mom, Beth is watching over her tonight in this honor. Julie is presently a Graphic Artist, Commercial Director of Wild Brain Inc., whose big contribution is the artwork and design for LeapFrog products. She has relocated to New York just this past week. JOHN KASSELAKIS

M.H.S. 1991—1994

John Kasselakis is as home grown as a Manhasset lacrosse player can be. Starting out in the Manhasset PAL and going on to star at Manhasset High School. John was the starting goalie as a sophomore and was an All-Conference selection in 1992. In his junior year, he was All-County and was an Empire State team member. He capped off his high school career in 1994. He was an All-American selection and also participated in the North/South game.

After high school, John went on to play at UMass. He started 2 games as a freshman and then was the full time goalie for the rest of his college career. In that time John has 477 saves and in 1997 he ranked 3rd nationally in goals against and save percentage. As a junior, John was selected to the All-New England team. John finished college in 1998 and left with All-American honors.

ELYSE QUINN CHERRY

M.H.S. 1983—1986

Elyse, a 1986 graduate of Manhasset, was a vital aspect of the scoring dynasty that has become the legendary 1st State Championship team of girls' lacrosse. In 1985, memories surround the season of ending Carle Place's 71 game win streak, beating Port 10-6 to capture a bid to the County final game, beating CSH in sudden victory overtime for the Nassau county title, and beating Rye 10-7 for the State Championship. Elyse was a part of the unstoppable scoring team of Whipple, Gallagher, Tortolani, Kenny, and Dicerbo – passing was innate, teamwork was unsurpassed. Elyse was credited with scoring over 40 goals and having 15 assists her Junior and Senior years. Although only "awarded" All-League status upon graduation, she certainly was the most "un-sung hero" of the mid-80's teams. She went on to Lynchburg College and presently is the other half of the first husband/wife team of the Manhasset Hall of Fame. She is married to Bill Cherry, Varsity Men's Lacrosse Coach and have 3 boys, Kyle, Jack and Luke — that alone deserves Hall of Fame status! GREG PAPAM.H.S. 1993—1996

Greg Papa graduated Manhasset High School in 1996 where he was a three year varsity starter in Football and Lacrosse. The 1995 lacrosse team won the first state championship for Manhasset. Greg was captain his senior year in both sports. He was a High School All-American in lacrosse and won the gold medal with the Long Island Empire team. In football, Greg was an All-County selection and participated in the first Long Island All star game between Nassau and Suffolk County. After Manhasset he played at Georgetown University helping them reach the final four in 1999. While at Georgetown he was a captain, two-time All-American and two-time Georgetown defensive player of the year. Greg participated in the college North/South all star game. After college, Greg participated on the NYAC club lacrosse team. He currently resides in Manhattan with his wife, Bridget and he assists with the youth league in Manhasset on Saturday mornings. Greg is a brother to Jennifer Papa & Carolyn Whaling, who are members of the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame, and is son to Regina & Eugene Papa.
