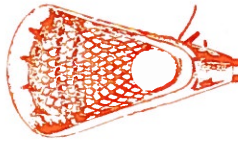

KARL "RUSTY" HUEGLIN **M.H.S. 1977-1981**

In the formative years of lacrosse at Manhasset, Karl "Rusty" Hueglin stood out as a team player and a leader on the front field of Manhasset High School. Rusty played from 1976-78, for Coach Alan Lowe, as a starting attack man.

Rusty went on to play at North Carolina for the Tar Heels, for only one year, 1982. Although it was a solitary year, that year proved to be monumental, as the team won the NCAA Championship, defeating Johns Hopkins two years in a row. North Carolina was ranked #1 in the twelve team, 12th year of D1 Men's Lacrosse. Defeating Navy (16-2) and Cornell (15-8), the team conquered the Blue Jays by a score of 7-5.

Rusty has given back to the sport by coaching the house and travel PAL teams from 1994-99, and also coached in the Wilton Youth program from 2000-2008, both boys and girls. He has also served as a Board member of the Wilton Lacrosse Association from 2002-2004.

Rusty is being honored this evening as a player and a contributor to the sport of Lacrosse. Congratulations, and welcome home – to the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame.



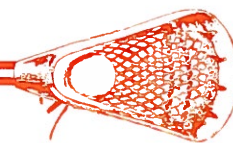
CHRIS MUCCILO **M.H.S. 1999-2003**

Chris is a 2000 graduate of Manhasset High School. As a three sport Varsity athlete, he excelled in Football, Basketball and Lacrosse. A leader on and off the fields and court, Chris was a senior captain for each one of his teams and preserved the integrity of a model student athlete. Chris was selected All-County in Football his junior and Senior years, two-time All-Conference player in Basketball and two-time All-County selection for Lacrosse. One of his most memorable Lacrosse experiences in high school was when he played for the 1999 Empire State Games, representing Long Island as a midfielder.

It was his passion for lacrosse that took him to Brown University, where he played for Coach Scott Nelson. As an All-American player, Chris immediately forged his mark. He was an All-Ivy Rookie of the Year in 2001 for his intensity, skill and goal scoring ability. Coach Nelson, claimed he was one of the "most confident players", as he progressed through his years and became a two-time All-Ivy and All-New England player. As a senior captain, Chris was selected MVP, and a New England Scholar Athlete. As a mid-fielder, Chris was a constant scoring threat and was awarded the 20 and plus goal scorer his sophomore through senior years.

Chris went on to play for the Boston Cannons of the MLL for 4 years. Although Chris has retired from playing the game he loves, being inducted into the Manhasset Hall Of Fame this evening has recreated the fond memories of his teams and fellow team members that brought him success and determination. Presently, Chris is a fixed income sales representative for HSBC. He is newly married to his wife, Oriana, this past October, and resides in New York City.

NICK MURTHA **M.H.S. 1985-1989**

Nick Murtha is being inducted this evening as being one of the greatest goalkeepers to have passed through Manhasset. Nick graduated in 1998, after playing for Coach Alan Lowe, and being one of Coach Bob Rule's protégé's on the Varsity team for 4 years. Nick's adaptability, quickness, speed, agility, and intensity qualified him as a two-time Empire State Team Gold Medalist. He was named the 1998 Nassau County Lacrosse Coaches Association's "Goalie of the Year", and was also named All-American Goalie, that senior year. Nick was an All-County and All-American in Lacrosse, and dabbled on the varsity wrestling team, and Football team, where he was a part of the County Championship team, his senior year.

Nick went on to play at highest caliber of Lacrosse tradition, history and success - Johns Hopkins, where he played for 4 years, wearing #19. Although Nick was never a part of a Championship team, 3 out of his 4 years, the Blue Jays made semi-final appearances. A "rookie" coach, Dave Pietramala was Nick's coach for both junior and senior years, where Nick had an outstanding end to his college career. He was named Senior Captain, and finished as a 1st Team All-American Goalie. He was also awarded the 2002 "Warrior" Goalie of the Year.

Nick continued his love for lacrosse and played for the Long Island Lizards for 7 seasons, as one of the "Fab 5". In his first year, the Lizards were both American League Champions and MLL World Champions. Nick ended his playing career with the Chicago Machine in 2006.

The love of the game has kept Nick involved so personally. He is a Master Coach, does numerous camps and clinics, and is the Founder and Co-Director of Prodigy Lacrosse. In his spare time, Nick has run the New York City Marathon, at least 3 times, and still cannot believe today, that starting with PAL Lacrosse, the sport has taken him to places beyond his dreams!

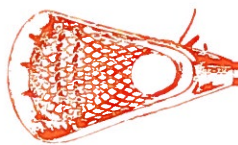
TIM REILLY **M.H.S. 1977-1981**

Tim was a 1987 graduate of Manhasset High School playing for Coaches Alan Lowe and Bob Rule. If his smile was an indication for success on or off the field, Tim would be a champion no matter what! His senior year, he was a team captain and leading scorer, and was named an All-County player. He was an Adelphi Scholar Athlete – which is awarded to the All-County player with the highest grade average, and was also selected to play in the Long Island Exceptional Senior game.

Tim went on to play for the Crimson at Harvard where his incredible passion for a sport, and his ability which flourished as a Manhasset youth, took off. He was a 4 year letterman on the Varsity Lacrosse team where he participated in 2 D1 playoffs both his sophomore and junior years, winning the title in 1990 (which is the last time Harvard won the Championship). He marked 43 career goals, and 41 assists. He was part of an amazing run as the Crimson was also Ivy League Champs his Junior year, as a midfield player, he was always a scoring threat, as he was one of the top 5 scorers throughout the season.

His senior year, Tim was named Captain of a team that had to defend their Championship season. He was awarded the Harvard Class of '59 Trophy for Leadership and Enthusiasm, was named All-Ivy Second Team and All-New England Second Team. He was selected to play in the North vs. South Senior Lacrosse Classic.

Tim is truly honored and humbled tonight, thinking he had a "nice" lacrosse career. Tim thought upon his graduation from Harvard that his Lacrosse career was over. He enjoyed his college career and achieved so much, that he thought playing Club Lacrosse might minimize his amazing run in Massachusetts. Little did he know that the highlight of his Lacrosse career has presently taken off again! He is presently a youth coach, throughout the year, in his hometown of Manhasset – for his children Megan, Brendan and Brian – while his very athletic and proud wife Patti Anne Kenny Reilly, cheers from the sidelines! LAUREN TAYLOR **M.H.S. 1992-1995**

Lauren is one of the finest players that Coach Tom Campolettano has ever been privileged to coach. She graduated in 2004 with huge accolades, yet went on to be an even more advanced collegiate player. While at Manhasset, Lauren was the leading scorer and assister on Long Island her senior year. She was named Honorable Mention All-American her junior year, where she helped Manhasset to the State Championship by scoring the winning goal in OT against East Rochester. She completed that feat her senior year, being named All-American, and was Captain of her team, as the Lady Indians won the Long Island Championship.

Lauren went on to play for the Bulldogs at Yale University for Coach Mandy O'Leary where her skill and ability soared both for Yale and nationally. Immediately, Lauren made the US National Team as a freshman, and sophomore, and was a 3-time All-American, and a 4-time First Team All-Ivy player. Her junior year, she was a standout for the team, as she was the NCAA National Leader in Goals per game, was the Ivy League Player of the Year, and was a Tewaarnton Trophy Nominee, awarded annually for the most outstanding American Collegiate Men's and Women's lacrosse players. In addition, Lauren was awarded the Barbara Bowditch Award for Yale's Most Valuable Player both Junior and Senior years. She was also awarded the very prestigious Yale's "Nellie Elliot Award" given to the top senior athlete of the graduating class.

In Lauren's first post-graduated year, she rejoined the Bulldogs, as an assistant coach, and in the past 6 years, she has been a former program manager at the Yale Global Health Leadership Institute, and is a presidential scholar of public health and medical ethics at Harvard Divinity School in Boston. She most recently co-authored the book *The American Health Care Paradox*, which raises the questions of increasing health care costs. 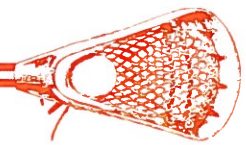
JULIET WHITE **M.H.S. 1999-2003**

Juliet had an awesome career, as a graduate of Manhasset High School in 2004. Her coach, Tom Campolettano said of her playing ability "We couldn't have achieved the feats that we accomplished without her unselfish level of play, her sportsmanship, and her finesse on the field". Juliet was a constant threat, as a mid-fielder, her transitions were key to her Junior year State Championship and Senior year Long Island Championship teams. Her coach Brandy Miller said – "Every loose ground ball you knew that somehow Juliet was going to come up with it! She was such a great team player, didn't need all the glory, just needed to be a huge part of the team." Juliet was a 4 year starter for both Basketball and Lacrosse, and was named captain of both of those teams her senior year. Among her accomplishments her senior year were, Newsday All-Long Island Team, All-County player and was a US Lacrosse Academic All-American both Junior and Senior years.

Juliet was the first recipient of the Diane Whipple Scholarship, and won the Harry W. Baugher Manhasset Hall of Fame Scholarship for her incredible ability and team effort. Juliet went on to play for the Big Red at Cornell where she succumbed to an injury that limited her play to 3 years. She continued her passion for lacrosse, and coached the Ithaca Youth Girls Lacrosse before moving back to Long Island.

Juliet has now returned to Long Island, and is working in Manhattan for a Lloyd's Syndicate, Beazley, as an Underwriter. Congratulations Juliet, your talent as a key player on the field, your leadership as a dedicated competitor, and your incredible drive and desire, has led you as a direct inductee into the Manhasset Lacrosse Hall of Fame.

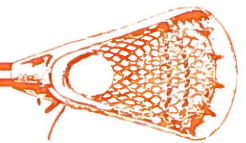
JIM BURNS 1954 -2013

Like so many of the college graduates before him, when Jim came home from school, he began coaching in the Manhasset PBC lacrosse program. He started out helping in the Intramural program and then replaced the legendary Harry Baugher Sr. as the 11-12 year old traveling team coach. P.O. Tom Raleigh tells a funny story about going down to the front field to watch one of Jim's first practices. When he pulled up in The PBC truck he asked the boys on the sideline, "didn't coach Burns show up today"?, they said yes, he's the one out there in the orange helmet. Tom, wasn't sure who was having more fun, Jim or his players. Tom said he had a hard time picking Jim out because he blended right in with the team.

When Jim left Manhasset he moved up to Bronxville, NY, where a group of parents were just starting a youth lacrosse program. Jim asked if they needed a coach and the rest is history. He would take a group of 3rd and 4th graders and coach them until their summer of their sophomore year in High School. Jim was an extraordinarily intense and dedicated coach who inspired his kids to practice in the off-season, prioritize lacrosse, and believe they could challenge the best teams in the state. That class produced Bronxville's first All-Americans, and the first team to make a run to the state semi-finals, and although Jim was no longer coaching them at that time, his fingerprints were all over everything they had achieved.

His love of the game brought a sport to a town where it did not exist previously. He helped transform a town into a lacrosse crazed one that now produces D-1 caliber players. The sport has truly lost a shining light.

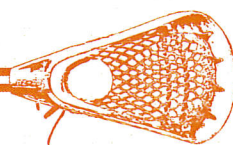

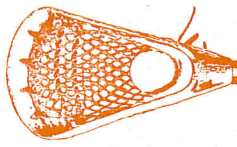
