GOAGH...

Alan Lowe

Alan was a two-time All-County selection at Hempstead High School in New York. At the University of Maryland, Lowe was a two-time All-American, a member of Maryland's national championship team in 1967 and the Atlantic Coast Conference



championship teams of 1965, 1966, and 1967. He represented Maryland in 1967 North/South Collegiate All-Star Game. Lowe played club lacrosse for the Mt. Washington and Long Island Lacrosse Clubs from 1968-1974. He was selected as a club All-Star six consecutive times. Lowe played for the U.S. Team in the Lacrosse World Championships of 1974 and was captain of that team. He coached Maryland's freshmen team in 1968 before becoming an assistant coach at East Meadow High School for four years. Since 1975, Lowe has been the head coach at Manhasset High School in New York, leading his teams to eleven league Championships, four county Championships, two Long Island Championships, and one State Runner-Up. Lowe was selected NCLCA Coach of Year in 1978. Record at Manhasset 297 wins and 76 losses.

PLAYERS...

Bill Hess..... Manhasset HS 1951-54

Bill is unique in that he could be inducted as a player or a coach. Bill had a stellar career at Manhasset High School, with an especially successful Senior year. That year, he was voted Captain and also the Most Valuable Player of his team, and he was recognized as an All-Scholastic player. Bill attended Penn State where he played both lacrosse and football. He received All-American honors in 1956 and 1957, and led the nation in scoring in 1957. To this date, he still holds the goal-scoring record. Bill's coaching career began when he returned to Manhasset High School as an Assistant under Ed Walsh. Bill has many other credits as an outstanding coach including Assistant Lacrosse and Football Coach at John Hopkins, Head Lacrosse Coach at Penn State, Assistant Varsity Coach at Naval Academy, Football and Lacrosse Coach at Philip Exeter Academy, and Head Lacrosse Coach at Middlebury College. Bill is a fine example of what Manhasset lacrosse is all about.

Vic Martocci...... Manhasset HS 1964-67

As a Senior, Vic made All-League Center in football, but no one was more dedicated to the Sport of Lacrosse. Vic showed his leadership qualities as Co-Captain of the 1967 Manhasset Lacrosse Team. The 1967 team appears on the back of this program and the team's 25th Anniversary of a perfect 18-0 season is being honored here tonight. As Senior Defenseman of the only undefeated team in Manhasset history, Vic helped the team hold the opposition to an average of only 2.16 goals per game. Vic earned All County honors and a Long Island Championship that year. Vic's dedication to the sport continued at Rutgers University where he was Captain his Senior Year and earned All-American Honors. He was nominated to the 1971 North/South All-Star Team and after graduation went on to play for the L.I.A.C. and N.Y. Lacrosse Club Teams.

Bill Bauer..... Manhasset HS 1975-78

Bill played Varsity Football and Basketball as well as Lacrosse. He was one of the outstanding all around midfielders to play at Manhasset. Bill earned All-County and All-American honors in his Senior year. He was the leading Face Off man and was excellent defensively as well as offensively. Bill entered West Point after graduation and was a four year starting midfielder with his team making the playoffs in his Sophomore, Junior and Senior years. After graduation he honored his country by serving four years in Oklahoma and five years in Germany. He was Field Artillary Man Commander in Europe during the break up of the Berlin Wall. We are all proud to have such a fine officer graduate from Manhasset High School.

Dick Wideyer PBC Director 1965-73


P.O. Dick Widmeyer came to Manhasset in 1965 to head the Manhasset PBC program. The Police Boys Club, sponsored by the Police Department but comprised of volunteer fathers



and supported by the Manhasset Community Fund, was a means of keeping the energies of the youth of Manhasset generated in a positive direction. Along with some very dedicated fathers, Dick was asked to incorporate the sport of lacrosse into the PBC sports framework. With Dick at the helm, the Manhasset PBC lacrosse program was launched. Thanks to Dick's organizational skills and dedication, the program grew rapidly to become one of the most successful youth lacrosse programs in the country.

Bill O'Connell Manhasset HS 1932-35

Bill is probably the greatest fan Manhasset athletes have ever had. Any of us who played sports at Manhasset High School remember Bill's cheer and words of encouragement. Bill was the Varsity Goalie on the 1934 and 1935 Manhasset Lacrosse



Teams. His coach was Jason Stranahan, the founder of Lacrosse on Long Island. Bill has served as President of the Manhasset Booster Club. He has been a great friend to the residents of Manhasset, both young and old. Bill has been honored as Man of the Year because of his service as a Manhasset Volunteer Fireman. Manhasset is a greater and safer town because of men like Bill O'Connell. We all thank him.
