In 1974, Pam graduated from Schreiber H.S. in Port Washington. She went on to Springfield College, where she helped develop their girls Lacrosse program and by her graduating year, they had their first Varsity Season. Fresh out of college, she started girls Varsity Lacrosse at Manhasset H.S. Those lean years of Lacrosse at Manhasset, proved to be the stepping stone of something big. Pam is now completing her sixteenth year of coaching and has built up the program to achieve two State Championships in 1985 and 1988, along with two other lost bids at the County finals. Pam's overall record at Manhasset is 179 wins 72 losses and 6 ties. Besides Pam's activity at Manhasset, she has been an active participant of girls lacrosse nationwide. She was chairperson of the schoolgirls All-American committee for 5 years and was the intrumental individual in allowing Long Island Schoolgirls the opportunity to participate at the National Tournament held every year during Memorial Day weekend. To this day, participation is very prestigious, and has seen many a recent Manhasset graduate.

PLAYERS...

Allyson Hutton...... Manhasset HS 1979-82

Allyson was a 1982 graduate of Manhasset H.S., who played in the "pioneer" days of girls Lacrosse. As a sophomore, Allyson played on the Varsity team, which was only in its second year of existance. She played on the team that was allowed by the USWLA to experiment with the first molded head stick. This type of stick is the one most chosen by girls and women today. Allyson played Center for three years and was elected an All-Star player and MVP upon her graduation. She went on to play for Dartmouth College, where she was the main stay of their program. She was Manhasset's first player selected to the U.S. Squad. Manhasset is etremely proud of Allyson being the first female Lacrosse player to be elected to the Manhasset Hall of Fame. With the way the girls program is progressing, there will surely be many more.

Mathew (Matty) Levine ... Manhasset HS 1967-70

Matty got his start as goalie while trying out for Frank Matocci's PBC Lacrosse traveling team. No one else would play the position, so Matty volunteered. Manhasset is glad he did. He went on to be a three-year varsity player at Manhasset H.S. He made All-Division in 1969 and All-County in 1970. He was voted Most Valuable Player in the 1970 County Championship game. Matty went to Williams College and was a four year starter for Head Coach Renzi Lamb. Matty had also played for Renzi in his sophomore year at Manhasset H.S. Mathew earned All-American Honors while at Williams in 1973-74. In addition, Matty enjoyed success playing Club ball for L.I.A.C. and New York Lacrosse Club from 1975-84.

Joe Capela Manhasset HS 1960-63

Someone forgot to tell Joe that he was too small to play Lacrosse. That's probably because Joe is proof that size is not the determining factor of your success in this great game. Quickness, determination, speed and guts will get the job done. Joe proved this as he was the key defenseman on Richie Moran's 1963, 19-1 L.I. Championship Team. That year Joe won All-Scholastic and All-North Shore honors. You could even say that with his great athletic ability and stick work, that he was the fore-runner to today's long stick midfielders. Manhasset is proud of Joe's great performance. Congratulations.

Eugene ("Eug") Miller<mark>Manhasset HS 1973-77</mark>

"Eug" played Lacrosse at Manhasset H.S. for four years, his senior year as captain for Allen Lowe's Team. He was named Athlete of the Year in 1977. However, due to a broken ankle early in the season, he saw limited action on the Lacrosse field. A late bloomer, his greatest success took place at Boston College where he was a two-time selection to the All New England Team and three times he was All Northeast. He was selected All-American in his senior year and the only player in Boston College history to play in the North-South Game. After college he played for several club teams and two seasons with the New York Saints. He considers his most fullfilling accomplishment to be that of organizing and coaching in the Greenwich Midget Lacrosse Youth League. When Eugene moved to town there was no youth lacosse program. Today, the Greenwich Program has over 400 boys and girls playing on Intramural and Travel Teams which was fashioned after the Manhasset P.A.L. Programs. Eugene was inducted into the Boston College Hall of Fame in 1992.

Albert (Al) Levine

Al was on the Manhasset PBC Board of Directors from 1959-72. He was President of the Manhasset Booster Club 1968-70. Al, along with Joe Fields, Charlie Morrison and Frank Martocci was a Co-Founder of the Manhasset PBC/PAL Lacrosse Program. Together with Frank and Emil Martocci, Al was Co-Sponsor and General Manager of the Manhasset/Mayfair Summer Lacrosse Club. He was also a member of the L.I.A.C. Board of Directors and served as its general manager for many years, which helped secure its eventual sponsorship of the L.I. Lacrosse Club. Never having played Lacrosse, Al is another great example of someone who got involved to help make this great sport a tradition in the Manhasset Community and throughout Long Island.

Tom Raleigh

PBC/PAL Director 1973-89

When Dick Widmyer announced his retirement in 1972, the Manhasset Community showed concern as to whom would be his replacement. When Tom took over in 1973, the Community learned very quickly that the future of the PAL Program was in capable hands.
